I look forward to seeing Wa Ying College continue to embrace the ideals set 110 years ago, nurturing lives through commitment and innovative educational ideas.


OUR 110TH ANNIVERSARY

Optimize the role and service areas of student leaders





Wa Ying is home to numerous student leadership organizations, with dedicated teachers working to help students take on leadership roles and serve the community. In recent years, our school has enhanced the roles and service opportunities for student leaders. Initiatives include organizing leadership training camps, mentoring prefects to provide academic support to students in junior forms, as well as empowering students in Peer Counselling Scheme to provide both focused and comprehensive assistance to newcomers.









Nurture students' vision and values by broadening their horizons and experiences





With the resumption of classes, our school actively invited guest speakers in various fields, each with notable achievements and valuable insights, to share their experiences with students. In the meantime, students were encouraged to engage in a variety of competitions and activities. To enrich their perspectives, deepen their knowledge, and foster self-confidence and values, we initiated visits and excursions to the mainland and other regions once the pandemic started to subside.











On 10 July 2024, our school had the privilege of hosting Professor Chai Yu as part of the "Beyond Dreams" I&T Talent Nurturing Programme. He shared fascinating insights into the latest developments in material science with our science students. The interactive session inspired many to consider pursuing careers in science and technology. The "Beyond Dreams" programme, launched by the Hong Kong Science and Technology Parks Corporation and China Resources (Holdings) Co., Ltd., aims to provide training, visits, and work experiences for students, encouraging them to engage with the I&T ecosystem.

Resume morning meetings and arrange a new schedule for weekly assemblies









As social distancing restrictions were gradually lifted, our school resumed morning assemblies that were suspended for several years. These assemblies served as a platform for teachers and various groups to share messages, hymns and life stories, encouraging students to cultivate the character and behavior we valued. We also introduced upcoming activities and engaged students in simple physical exercise. In addition, weekly assemblies, previously held in the morning, were shifted to the afternoon, to provide more preparation time for those organizing them.

Restart service learning



In June 2023, the service program which all Form four students should complete by the end of the school year was resumed. Through workshops and hands-on field service, students rekindled a sense of purpose and attained vitality from volunteering, while cultivating a positive attitude towards community service.





"Waying Lectures" during the epidemic and back-toschool activities after the epidemic









Throughout the epidemic, the school provided diversified activities to engage students learning from home. Beyond regular online interactions between class teachers and students, the school organized over 40 sharing sessions covering topics involving daily life, university experiences and career talks. Once classes resumed, we planned a series of events to warmly welcome students back to campus, ensuring they felt a sense of care and belonging upon their return.

Implementations of form development plans







Student development largely depends on the care of class teachers, and support given by the school is indispensable. Since 2022, development plans for each grade level have been introduced at the beginning of the school year. These plans encompass life education, life planning, study workshop, reading time and assemblies, enabling class teachers to formulate comprehensive year-long strategies to assist students' growth. In addition, the principal, vice-principals and assistant principal also serve as advisors in all levels, offering class teachers support and guidance.

New collaboration in life education: we work together







In the past two years, a variety of new activities were developed through the collaboration of teachers, social workers, alumni, parents, our church and students. For example, the three-day Christmas Market featured diverse activities and stalls that fostered a spirit of joy and mutual support. Parent workshops and gatherings organized collectively by teachers, social workers, and parents were well received. The church also readily extended its support by offering encouragement and blessings to senior students and graduates.

The concept behind the new campus environment and new facilities







While our school eagerly anticipates in-situ redevelopment, the efforts to enhance the campus environment and facilities have never stopped, with the aim of providing both teachers and students with a better space for teaching, self-study, and spiritual well-being. Development projects undertaken include transforming the underground covered playground into the 3.7 Cafe, establishing a fitness room, optimizing the staff's leisure and lunch gathering areas, and revamping the podiums on the first and second floors. Additionally, we have improved the social workers' room and counseling room, the audiovisual systems in the hall and covered playground, air-conditioning in the hall, as well as the facilities of Form One and Form Six classrooms. Prioritizing the learning of students and optimizing the space for teachers and students to relax and interact are core principles underlying these developments.

Alumni support behind the five domains of career exploration













One of the core tasks of secondary education is to help students understand their potential and interests through career exploration, which in turn generates motivation for learning and assists students to identify their future academic and developmental paths. Over the past two years, we have refined our school-based career planning system. Based on the support of the Alumni Association and various social resources, we have categorized student development into five key domains, utilizing a more structured and tailored model to facilitate the career exploration of our students.

A new chapter for sister schools







Previously, we established a sister school partnership with Foshan No. 1 Middle School. After the end of the epidemic, we formed sister school pairs with Foshan Huaying School, Foshan Gaoming Huaying School and Beijing National Day Experimental School in Haidian District of Beijing. This collaboration allows us to gain insight into the latest educational development of our country. It also deepens students' understanding of the abilities of mainland students, fostering sincere and healthy exchanges of ideas.

Diversified family support









During the pandemic, students and their families spent significantly more time together at home compared to the past while the time for learning taking place at school reduced. In response to this, we introduced various initiatives to support families, such as movie appreciation and workshops for parents, 'Sunshine calls', Wa Ying letters and evening tea gatherings. Over the past two years, membership in the Parent Volunteer Group has steadily increased. This indicates the close home-school cooperation, for which we are grateful.

PROSPER as a reference for Positive Education













PROSPER framework is the guiding principle we base on when planning the support we offer to our students' growth. Over the past three years, to facilitate a better understanding of this framework among our colleagues, study groups and training sessions were organized for middle-managers, staff and new colleagues respectively. The school-based life education curriculum, assemblies and training offered by social workers of our school also helped forge our consensus in the ways we integrate elements of Positive Education in daily teaching.





HIGHLIGHTS OF 2021-2024

Ensuring stability of teaching systems, developing students' effectiveness and maturity for learning

The severe epidemic has disrupted the stability of classroom teaching and hindered students from establishing good study habits. Over the past three years, our school has prioritized establishing a stable learning system, cultivating students' study habits and supporting their personal growth during critical stages of development.

Establish a special timetable for 2021-2024







During the pandemic, our school experienced three teaching modes: full-day online classes, half-day online and half-day face-to-face classes, and full-day face-to-face classes. To ease the strain on the administrative team and help teachers and students adapt to the new timetable, we launched a versatile set of lesson arrangements that can accommodate three teaching modes in the early stages of the epidemic. This approach facilitated easier adjustments and responsiveness for both teachers and students whenever needed.









On 10 April 2024, students were excited to visit Xue Long 2, the Chinese icebreaking research vessel. It was an eye-opening experience for our science students and STEM team members to understand more about the science of icebreaking vessels and the technological advancement of China. After the visit, students had the opportunity to interact with the scientists of Xue Long 2 and Zhongshan Station in Antarctica. It was definitely a valuable experience for them to expand their horizons through meaningful dialogue with renowned scientists.

Supplementary measures to balance learning and development











The timetable adopted in this transitional period has distinctive characteristics. The sixth and seventh periods of each day were utilized to create more opportunities and platforms for each subject to arrange programs beyond regular teaching, thereby enhancing students' learning experiences and supporting balanced development in junior forms. For example, English drama programs, Chinese reading and writing programs, integrated humanities projects for Form 1 students, self-selected scientific inquiry activities for Form 1 and Form 2 students, and arts education workshops were arranged.





Establish an administrative team to take care of less able students







During the suspension of classes, we assisted individual students who were struggling to study effectively at home by arranging individual academic tutoring in person or online. Starting in the 2022 school year, our school set up an academic support unit under the Academic Board to integrate various existing and newly established tasks, providing support to students who need assistance with their learning progress.

Establish a talent pool to develop students with better abilities









Since 2022, our school established a talent pool under the Gifted Education Unit to recruit students who are the award winners or those nominated by teachers. We aimed to increase their exposure to various competitions and training opportunities and facilitated the sharing and communication among the students.

Extend cross-disciplinary language learning programs









Many students have to adapt to changes in the language of instruction after enrolling at Waying. Furthermore, the epidemic has exacerbated the challenges faced by many students. Hence, we extended the Language Across Curriculum program to Form 2 during the pandemic. As the number of participating subjects and teachers increased, continued support could be provided to individual students after they were promoted to Form 3.

Resume reading lessons for habit building











The unique features of the new timetable offered us unprecedented flexibility. More class time was allocated to cultivate regular reading habits among students. A series of activities were launched, including the introduction of e-reading pilot programs and platforms, three-minute reading sharing, reading camps, and other initiatives designed to encourage students to maintain a habit of reading both at school and at home, to lay a foundation for more in-depth pursuit of knowledge.

Curriculum design for language subjects — from reading to writing







Learning through reading, followed by organizing and applying the knowledge through writing, is an essential part of the language learning process. The Chinese subject rolled out a project in junior forms to develop a school-based curriculum that integrates reading and writing. The English subject also selected specific reading materials at all levels to help students engage with academic articles or popular topics in various fields.


Lesson study and optimization of lesson observation forms







Our school conducted a series of intra-school, cross-school, and cross-regional lesson study activities, including in-house lesson study workshops and peer observations led by the Principal, Vice-Principals, and subject leaders. Additionally, staff members participated in open-class lesson observations at various schools such as Tsung Tsin Christian Academy and Fanling Kau Yan College. A lesson study tour to Taiwan was also organized to enable over ten teachers to learn effective approaches to support students' learning.

Student handbook, study workshops and habit development









In the past three years, our school focused on nurturing students to be more mature learners. To achieve this goal, we established regular study workshops for junior forms, to guide students to develop effective learning habits. The student handbook was revised to allow students to set learning plans and facilitate the sharing among students and the inspections of class teachers. Students were also encouraged to plan their personal learning progress based on the subject guidelines and syllabus they got at the beginning of the term.

Learning methods and experience sharing







To offer diverse support for students with different needs and learning styles, we organized sharing and workshops to address their needs at different stages. Alumni and senior students shared their insight with junior form students, on methods to adapt to the new learning environment, the selection of C-cube classes in Form 2, preparation for subject choices in Form 3, the ways to face academic challenges in senior forms, the choice of a university path, preparation for HKDSE in summer vacation, the planning of revision schedule with an appropriate mindset and suitable strategies.

Optimize the mentoring programs for Form 3 students on selecting elective subjects







Throughout the past 3 years, our school continued to optimize the mentoring system for Form 3 students to help them select suitable electives for their senior years. In addition to our previous programs, we implemented new initiatives including 'taster lessons', HKDSE questions try-out sessions, senior student-led course introductions, counseling during assemblies as well as sharing with the principal during lunch. With the available resources, students were arranged to participate in senior lessons, allowing them to experience the learning mode and atmosphere in senior forms.









Optimize the learning support system for Form 6

We constantly refine our strategies to support Form 6 students. The new measures included launching a study room specifically for Form 6, year-round mini-activities to encourage students, academic tutoring catering for students of different levels, alumni experience sharing and a second mock test. Since the summer of 2024, we conducted a uniform test for Form 6 students scheduled from late August to early September. This allowed students to apply the knowledge they had revised during the summer vacation. For the past two years, all graduating Form 6 students received a 'Wa Ying bear'. This gift symbolizes our blessings and appreciation for their hard work and dedication shown throughout the school year.











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WELL-ROUNDED DEVELOPMENT

Wa Ying emphasizes and puts ample resources into providing well-rounded education for our students, investing significantly in both the formal curriculum and non-formal curriculum to enhance the overall quality of our students and graduates. We create a supportive atmosphere that enables Wayingers to achieve excellence based on their passions and talents. While we applaud the active involvement of all our students, the following students truly stand out for their exceptional efforts. We take immense pride in acknowledging the remarkable accomplishments of these students, who have shown extraordinary commitment, determination and persistence.

Achievements In Key Learning Areas

STEM Education





Our students participated in the Hong Kong Biology Literacy Award (2023/2024). Their outstanding performance earned our school the Best School Award in the Heat Written Test. Zhao Yi An (S5) achieved First Class Honours, Liu Tung Sum (S5) and Sun Yan Long (S5) received Second Class Honours, and Leung King Wai (S5) earned Third Class Honours.

Additionally, one of our teams ranked among the top 8 with the highest average scores in the heats, advancing to the final 5-minute presentation contest and securing the second runner-up position. The team members were Cheung Chak Lam (S5), Sun Yan Long (S5), Leung King Wai (S5) and Zhao Yi An (S5).



Our school sent a team of 10 students, 2 from each form (S1 – S5), to join the The Hong Kong Youth Mathematical Challenge (HKYMC) 2024, where they secured the overall first runner-up in the secondary school category.

The students' efforts were truly commendable, resulting in 4 Gold Awards, 4 Silver Awards and 2 Bronze Awards. In particular, Fu Chuen Hei (S1) achieved a top 3 score in the Algebra subpaper and won the Gauss Award (高斯獎) in S1. Additionally, Fu Jiexi excelled by scoring in the top 3 in the Algebra, Number Theory and Geometry subpapers, earning the Gauss Award (高斯獎), Fermat Award (費馬獎) and Euclid Award (歐幾里德獎) in S2. Fu Jiexi (S2) also secured the first runner-up position in S2.



Ng Yuk Hei (S2) achieved Double Distinction in both Mathematics and Problem-solving in the 2023 World Class Tests organized by World Class Arena in November 2023.

Tsoi Man Lung (S5) and Cheung Chak Lam (S5)(left to right) won the championship and the Best Report Award at the Competition on System Modeling & Optimization (COSMO) 2024, after competing against 51 teams. COSMO is co-organized by the Department of Systems Engineering and Engineering Department of The Chinese University of Hong Kong and The Hong Kong Association for Computer Education.











With our students' innovative sensitivity and aesthetic prowess regarding the iconic Hong Kong trams, the team of Kwok Pak Hei (S4) and Chung Chak Ho (S4) was awarded the Best Innovation Award in the first citywide transportation-themed design thinking STEAM competition, BuilDING Our Future Grand Challenge. They were also awarded the Audience Choice Award and Merit Award.

Language Education



In the Hong Kong Secondary School Debating Competition 2023-2024, the English Debating Team achieved remarkable success, securing a championship and a first runner-up position in the regional Grand Finals at both the junior and senior levels. Notably, our junior team won the championship in the Term



2 Final. Team members Leung King Wai (S5) and Hong Chi Yin (S3) were honored with the Best Debater Award in the senior and junior grand finals respectively.





The English Debating Team earned the Silver Award in the Hong Kong Youth Debate Association Cup 2024, showcasing their exceptional skills and dedication.







In June 2024, members of our English Drama Club represented our school during a visit to our sister school in Beijing, the Beijing National Day Experimental School. Five student representatives delivered an engaging performance of a radio drama for the Form 1 students there. Following that, students from both schools shared a memorable experience interacting with one another and participating in role-playing based on the radio drama script created by our students.



Wu Ka Ki (S3) participated in the 26th Hong Kong Primary and Secondary School Putonghua Speech Contest 2024, demonstrating impressive skills in Putonghua speaking. She secured the second runner-up position in the Junior Secondary category for the Kowloon region.



Wu Ka Ki (S3) participated in the 天馬盃 2023-2024 全港中文寫作比賽 organized by the Hong Kong Art Education Association. In the junior secondary group, Ka Ki won the championship for the topic " 再 見 · !"



Lee Yin Tung (S1) participated in the Putonghua Solo Verse Speaking category at the「香港學界公開賽」暨第十八屆「BNCL 證書」學術才藝大賽, as well as the 第十九屆善行盃全港才藝大賽. She won the championship and a gold award.



《吾土吾情》, co-authored by students and teachers from 3 schools including ours, documents a year-long immersive cultural learning experience in Hong Kong, providing a local in-depth travel guide. Our teachers lead students into various communities to experience the traditional cultural characteristics of Hong Kong. The book aims

to help readers understand students' perspectives on cultural heritage and witness the richness of Hong Kong's cultural legacy. Wong Yan Yan (S5) and Hung Wing Yan (S5), two of our student authors, represented our school at the "2024 Hong Kong Book Fair X 《吾土吾情》Author Seminar" book release event.



Personal, Social & Humanities Education





Our student leaders Cheung Hok Ying (S5), Or Yuen Ting (S5), Lee Hiu Nam (S5), Iu Ching Nam (S5) and Chin Ka Long (S5) participated in the PolyU Igniting Social Innovation Competition 2024. After three rounds of selection, the team impressed the judges with a short film focusing on family issues and won the first prize.


