PRINCIPAL'S REMARKS

am humbled by and grateful for how God blessed this school with unity and loving efforts of the school supervisor, managers, teachers, staff, alumni, parents and students.

We have worked hard to kick-start planning for celebratory events for our 50th school anniversary and in-situ school redevelopment, and I believe it is apt to summarize the past year with "preparation" in "unity". In November 2018, we witnessed the opening of our new Archive Room, which serves as a testament to God's guidance in every step Wa Ying has taken since it was first founded in Foshan. The room's troffer, in the shape of a cross, precisely represents our gratefulness to Him. For the redevelopment of the school campus, with the green light given by Education Bureau to our proposal, our Board of Directors has established various small working groups that focus on the many facets of the upcoming celebration and redevelopment. The Alumni Association also initiated Journey of Dreams 2.0 to garner graduates' efforts to contribute to this grand project.

In curriculum development, we have channeled our

energies into effective teaching and learning. We have continuously exchanged ideas with different schools and educational groups in the past year. Their experiences provide us with insights that can strengthen our capacity to proactively and comprehensively evaluate our students' learning needs and identify the school's areas for improvement. In the past HKDSE exam, our graduating class achieved remarkable results that have surpassed those of previous years, with almost half of them having been admitted to the University of Hong Kong, or the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology

Our school also spares no effort to develop students' whole-person development. Life education values are delivered in the form of Expressive Arts in curriculum. Character strengths are cultivated through multiple opportunities to participate in service education. Platforms are given to allow students to showcase their talents. All these practices stem from our belief that it is equally important to plant the seeds of self-love and respect for others in students' minds, in addition to academic development.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2018-19

BUILDING A LEARNING COMMUNITY FOR TEACHING PROFESSIONALISM

In order to address the educational demands of the 21st Century, it is important to enhance professionalism of our teaching staff. Learning among teachers can best foster teachers' ability to ever-improve in teaching and learning; and with enhanced capability in self-reflection, they can further refine their pedagogical practices. We have been building a learning community through peer learning over a specified teaching focus with lesson observation and subsequent discussion and feedback. What's more, university professors and educational experts have been invited to offer professional input and comments over the lessons. CROSS-CURRICULAR STEM PROJECT: FROM UNDERSTANDING TO PROBLEM SOLVING

The successful implementation of Form 2 STEM project in 2017-18 has further nurtured the school culture in cross- KLA (Key Learning Area) collaboration: collaboration has extended from Design and Technology (DT) and Integrated Science (IS) to DT, IS, Mathematics (Math) and Computer Studies. It has also brought insights to the development of school-based junior STEM curriculum, which was enriched and extended to Form 1 in 2018-19 by incorporating learning elements from more KLAs.

The "Water Filtration Column Design Project", an interdisciplinary theme-based and design-and-make project, was introduced in the cross-KLA F1 STEM curriculum. As for the cross-KLA theme for Form 2 STEM project, it was changed from "STEM Room" to "Ideal Home" so as to heighten students' involvement in creating their dream house. Students were empowered to master different subject-based knowledge and skill-sets in application to solve real-life problems through hands-on and minds-on STEM related activities which nurtured them a spirit of scientific enquiry and entrepreneurship. The curriculum has not only helped enhance students' understanding of the connections of key concepts on a shared theme across different subjects, but has also further extended the lateral coherence across KLAs.




READING TO LEARN: COLLABORATIVE EFFORTS TO FOSTER READING

To cope with the demands in this digital era and knowledge-based society, students have to master "Reading to Learn" skills, which enhance their overall learning capacity leading to lifelong learning and whole-person development. Reading to learn was therefore highlighted as one of our major concerns this year, with the aim of fostering a culture of reading to enhance students' capacity for self-directed learning. It is our belief that individual efforts are never comparable to the synergy of collaboration. The following cases exemplify how different units or departments, both inside and outside school, sharing the same goal, could work together to foster the love for reading among students.

READING CAMP — JOINTLY ORGANIZED BY THE SCHOOL LIBRARIAN CLUB,

ENGLISH AND CHINESE DEPARTMENTS

About thirty book lovers, namely School Librarians, Chinese Ambassadors and English Reading Ambassadors participated in the first Reading Camp organized in Wa Ying College. Through a detective game about famous fictional characters, an engaging talk about the famous Wuxia novelist, Mr Louis Cha (金庸) delivered by our Chinese teacher, as well as various reading sharing among the participants, students were invited to a new domain of reading experience.

STRENGTH-BASED AND POTENTIAL-BASED ARTS EDUCATION

With the objectives of developing students' character and potential, diversified learning and teaching strategies such as adopting a wide range of arts modalities, applying the knowledge of Expressive Arts in Arts Education and integrating life education value into the curriculum have been implemented. Our Visual Arts curriculum has been commended over its integration of the knowledge of dance, drama, music and even creative writing to empower students' self-reflection and self-expressions. Our teachers' pioneer endeavor to integrate Expressive Arts into Arts Education and enrich the VA curriculum with Expressive Arts for whole-person development in the experimental F.2 C³ class "Arts in Life and Local Culture" was highly recognized.

CULTIVATION OF CHARACTER STRENGTHS THROUGH SERVICE EDUCATION

Service education has been implemented since New Secondary School education, through mass talks or sharing in assemblies and students' self-initiated learning in actual participation of community services. We aim to nurture students' concern for our community, especially the needy and the underprivileged; provide them an opportunity to plan their own learning and personal growth; and develop their critical thinking, communication and organization skills through services.

With recent implementation of life education in senior forms, service education has been incorporated into Form 4 Life Education as an experiential learning package, with briefing, community services and post-service sharing and debriefing. This year, a holistic service education program with collaboration of different committees was offered to Form 4.

Moral and Civic Education Committee (MCEC) was responsible for the learning package, including briefing, postservice sharing and debriefing.

STRENGTH-BASED AND POTENTIAL-BASED EDUCATION

"Wa Ying's Got Talent" is one of the most popular school functions with much student participation. 



A CONTINENT EXPLORATION TOUR TO MADAGASCAR

Having been shortlisted to join the 8th Continent Exploration Tour, Lam Ching Ho (F4) had a rare opportunity to visit Madagascar for 15 days. Together with 10 experts and 19 peers from other schools of Hong Kong, they discovered many endangered animal species in different national parks. 





No joy can be compared to a teacher's satisfaction in hearing the good news of their students' youthful dreams, after years of persistence and hard work, come true.

This year, Alfred Sung and Lee Hoey, Simon, the two good buddies of Kai Seh, have their youthful dreams at Wa Ying College come true in the same year of 2019.

Lee Hoey Simon, having the dream to serve his country since F.6, had served as the Deputy Governor in the Xifeng County of GuiZhou Province (貴州省貴陽市息烽縣), one of the poorest provinces of China, in 2009-2012, and now engages in the research over business and national policy in the Bay Area as the Director of China Resources Group Bay Area Office. This year, he was appointed **The Justice of the Peace**, **2019**, for his contribution in the study and research of Hong Kong Basic Law; legal education as a researcher and consultant in the Law School of Harvard, Tsinghua and HKU; and his studies in local districts with analysis of the daily needs of different classes of Hong Kong citizens from a management think tank perspective.
